To Ease Work of Tire Changing.
The nuts and threads on the rim lug bolts should be oiled every time a tire is changed, so that they will tighten up readily. If they become too dry it may be thought that the nuts are too tight when they are not, with the result that the driving lug, which holds the rim in position, is pulled out, allowing the rim to shift and cut off the valve stem.
