AN ENTHUSIASTIC MEETING IS HELD At Newburgh in the interests of Mr. R. J. Bushell, Progressive.

An enthusiastic meeting in the interests of Mr. R. J. Bushell, the Progressive candidate, was held on Saturday night at Newburgh. The chair was taken by Mr. Anson Aylesworth, the reeve, and there was a good crowd present to listen to the speakers.

The Progressive candidate, who was given a splendid reception, referred to the success that he had made of the Kingston Fair. He told the audience that if they would send him to Ottawa he would work day and night in their interests. In proof of his ability to get things for the farmers he pointed to the fact that during the year that he was honored with the position of President of the Vegetable Growers Association he had succeeded in having the weight of a bushel of turnips reduced from 60 lbs. to 50 lbs., which meant an annual saving to the farmers of Frontenac and Addington of thousands of dollars every year.

Mr. Bushell pointed out that the Progressives had held a very important position during the last Parliament and he stated that the indications were that they would hold a very important position in the new Parliament. They would be able to get things from the Government in the interest of the farmers, because of the fact that they would hold the balance of power and he urged the farmers of Addington to support him and send him down there so that he could demand legislation in their interests.

Other speakers were Mr. J. C. Bell, who dealt with the tariff problem, and Mr. Joseph McGrath, who spoke briefly.
