"Miss 1926" Independent. Bournemouth, England.—"The modern girl looks the whole world in the face and fears not any man," said Mrs. Barnett Smith, better known as Annie S. Swann, the novelist, in a defence of "Miss 1926" when presenting prizes to a girls school. "She just wants to be left alone for a little while to find her feet," the writer added.

Philipp, who succeeded the late Konstantin Fehrenbach, Centrist party leader and fourth chancellor of the republic, as the 33rd woman member of the Reichstag, has come to the defence of the much-abused modern girl in Germany, though she has no children of her own. Saka said that he first would attend the International Conference of Highways, Ports and Harbors in Rome, as Japan's representative, and then would investigate the suffrage situation in those countries that have given the vote to women.

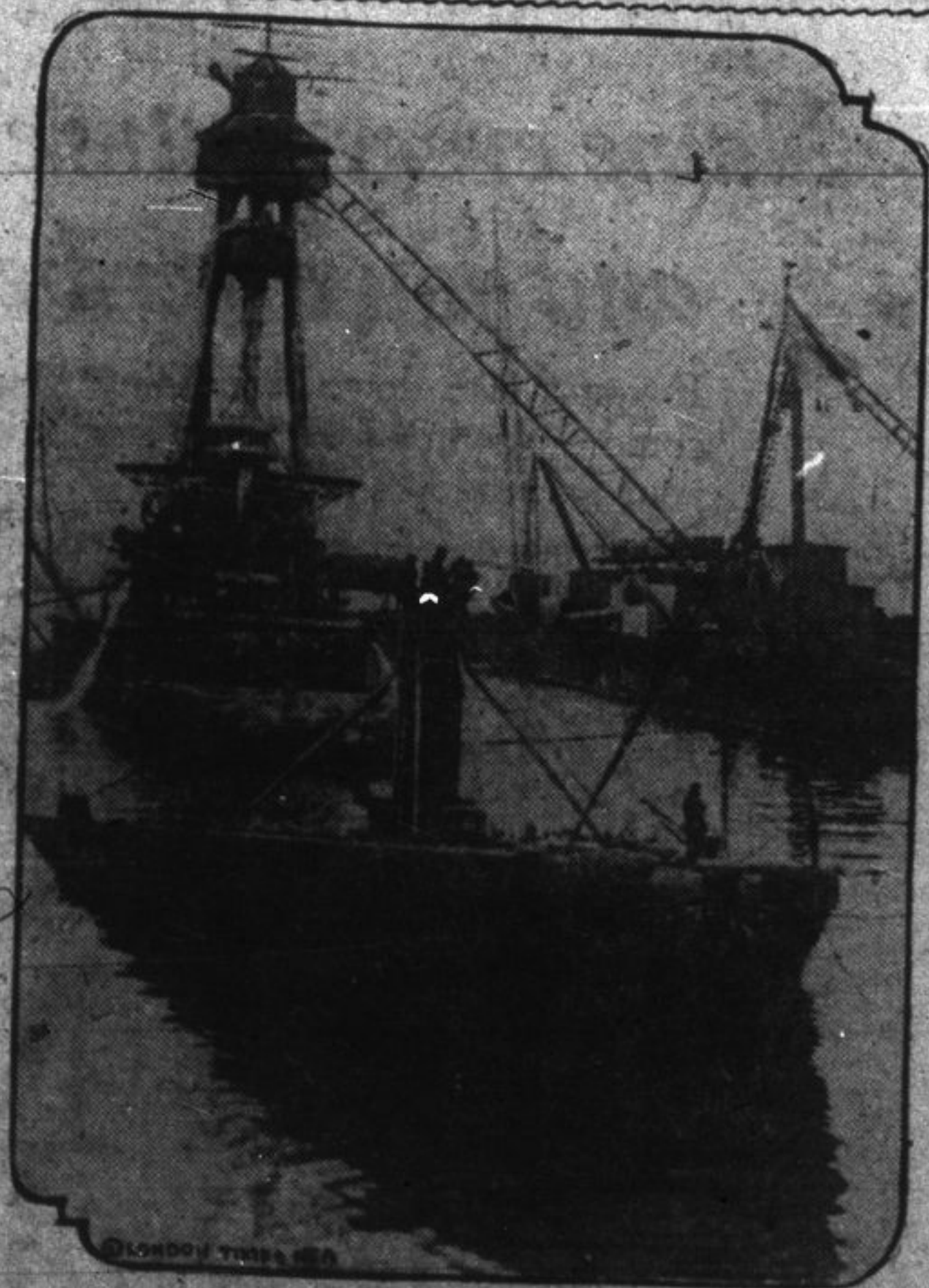

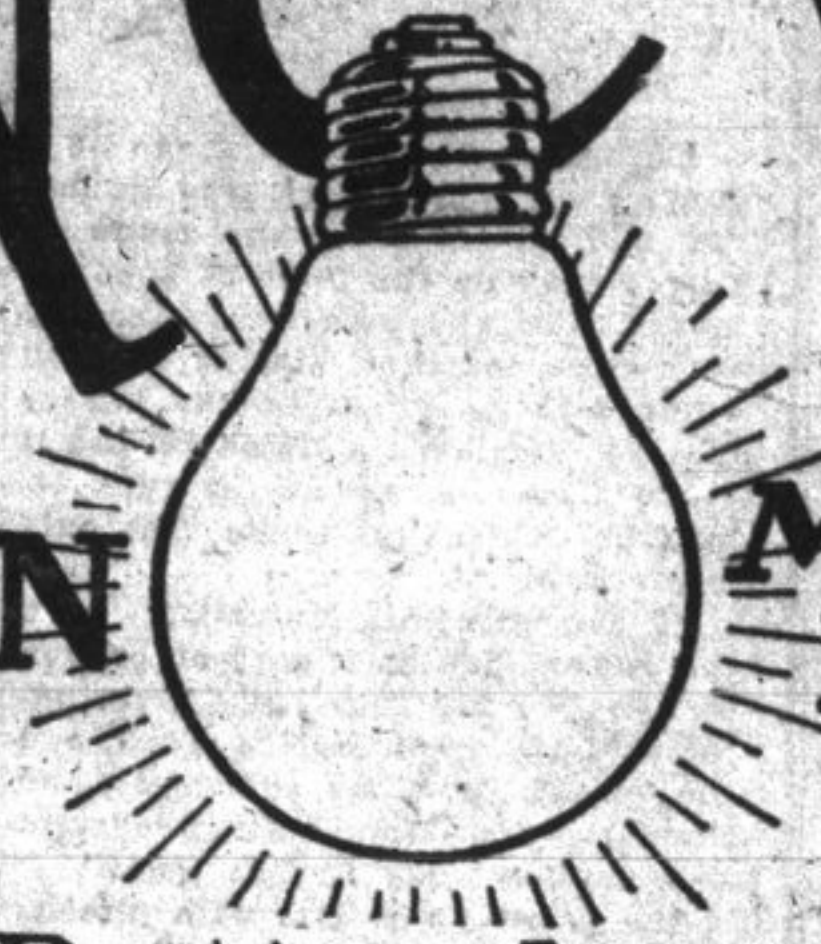


BARNACLED RELIC OF HATE
