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PRIZE WINNERS AT ODESSA FAIR

The Main Features Called Off
on Wednesday Owing to
the Rain.

Although the rain fell very heavily on Wednesday, hundreds of people made their way to the village of Odessa for the purpose of attending the annual show of the Ernestown Agricultural Society. The rain fell all morning, and any hope that there was of holding the horse races vanished. And by noon it was an assured fact that the horses would not leave the stable, as the track was a sea of mud in places. The baseball games which were also slated to take place were also called off.

Despite the fact that the main features of the afternoon programme were called off, the large number of people present did not seem to be disheartened in the slightest—while the rain was falling they spent their time in the Palace, which contained the best collection of exhibits ever seen at Odessa fair. When the sun came from behind a cloud at about three o'clock, the crowd visited the cattle sheds, and the midway, and they did not appear to mind the mud in the slightest.

The directors are naturally disappointed, but nevertheless they are looking forward to a bigger and better show next year.

Wonderful Vegetables.

W. J. Smyth, Cataragu, who has acted in the capacity of judge of the vegetables for thirteen years, when speaking to the Whig, stated that the exhibit this year was about the best on record. Some of the vegetables were a great deal better than those at either the Kingston or Napanee shows. The exhibit of squash was almost beyond description—there were twenty in the class for three prizes, and the winner weighed about sixty pounds, some squash. The pumpkins, like the squash, were fine, about fifteen being shown. The cabbage were a tremendous size; the two winning the first prize, weighed twenty-five pounds. There were five exhibitors of pears, as compared to one of last year. The potatoes were so good that it was a difficult task to award the prize. When asked by the Whig man, if he noticed a blight, Mr. Smyth stated that there might be, but it certainly did not show in the ones at the fair, as a potato was cut in every lot, and he found only one blighted. The apples were better than those at the Kingston fair, Mr. Smyth stated, and the carrots and beets were also of a fine order.

The poultry, cattle, sheep and pigs were larger in number than in previous years, and there was more competition in all classes. The ladies' work and domestic science was of fine order. The pies and cakes looked so good that they made the mouth water.

Mrs. George Bliss, of Elginburg, who won a first and a special on five prints of butter, has established a record as a butter-maker. She has won first three times at Odessa and four times at Kingston and she expects to enter at the Winter Fair in Toronto this year.
