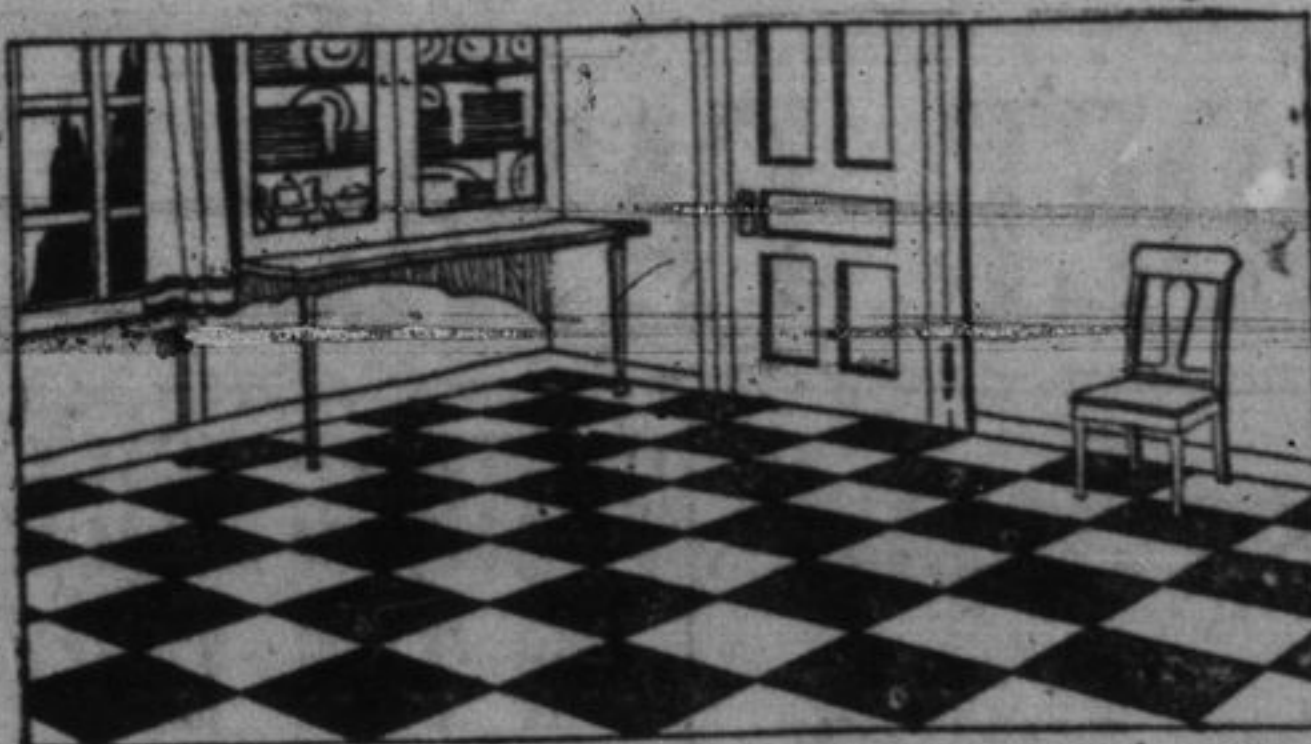
### MAY START NEW TROOP.

### GREAT OPPORTUNITIES FOR WORK IN CHINA

Rev. J. S. Harrington, Toronto, Delivers Splendid Address at Bible Society Meeting.

The Kingston Bible Society held its annual meeting at Chalmers' United Church Hall, Monday evening, and the hall was filled to capacity for the interesting lecture given by Rev. J. S. Harrington, of the Upper Canada Bible Society, Toronto. The Society elected its officers at a supper held early in the evening. The lecture of Rev. Mr. Harrington was illustrated by lantern slides.

The subject of the lecture was "China," and the audience was greatly interested in the way in which the lecturer fully explained the country. The lantern slides were beautiful, being pictures which the speaker had himself taken while in China, as a missionary. He showed and explained the various places of interest in the Oriental country, especially pointing out the queer religious beliefs of these people. Curiously enough, these people, he said were glad to listen to anyone who wished to speak to them. The work of the Bible Society in China is quite pronounced, the lecturer said, and he showed pictures of the colporteurs, who distributed the Bibles, and also transcriptions of the Book in the Oriental language. He stressed the fact that there are great opportunities for work in China.

China is the only civilization remaining practically unchanged since the time of Christ. The country is almost double the area of Canada in size, and has a population of 400,000,000.

One point brought out by the lecturer was the fact that Kingston had been the spot where the first translation of the Bible was made. It was made by Rev. John Stuart and Chief Joseph Brant, and translated into the Mohawk language. The body of Rev. John Stuart was buried in St. Paul's church yard, and the grave is still very prominent, with its broken tomb-stone. Rev. J. S. Harrington said that he thought Kingston should make some fitting memorial for the work which Rev. John Stuart did.

The report given of the work of the Bible Society, showed that of the money collected during the year, \$457, had been sent to the Upper Canada Bible Society in Toronto. The officers of the Kingston Bible Society elected for the ensuing year are as follows: President, Dr. E. J. Lake; vice-president, Dr. R. E. Sparks; secretary-treasurer, George E. Hague.

Committee—Ministers of local churches, and Messrs. A. F. Chown, D. A. Shaw, M. W. Harlow, A. J. Shannon, A. K. Williams, William Clyde, J. Bunt, R. D. Sloan.
