HELPFUL GOLF HINTS

Looking up is often the cause of that terrible complaint called socketing. The very word is hideous, but it is nothing compared to the results of the disease. I can truthfully say that I very seldom fail a victim to this complaint, but I have socketed quite enough shots to be able to realize the agonies one can suffer when in the grip. There is no bad shot in golf which furries a player so much as a shot off the socket and this accounts for the repetition of the mistake.

The more socketed shots I see played, the more I am convinced that the cause is to be found in the arm action.

The club is taken back in a hurried manner, and on the forward swing the player throws out her arms, with the result that the club-head is thrust too far out at the moment it meets the ball.

The player who is suffering from an attack should go to a quiet corner of the course and try the following cure:

Put a handkerchief under the left armpit, take a firm stance with the weight well on the heels, keep the head still and the left arm close to the body throughout the shot. If the handkerchief remains in the position in which it was placed, it is almost impossible to socket.

BASEBALL PROBLEMS

With runners on first and third, a double steal is started as the pitcher stands on the rubber. How should this play be broken up by the team in the field?

The fact that the runners start this play as the pitcher sets on the rubber is what usually confuses the situation.

Should the pitcher throw the ball to the plate while standing on the rubber, it would be a legal pitch and the catcher would be forced to handle the ball in the usual manner before making a play on the runner.

Incidentally, the batsman would have a right to swing at the ball if he cared to do so, in an effort to help out the runner.

Likewise, if the pitcher first stepped in the direction of first as the play was started, he would be compelled to throw the ball to that base or make a balk.

The only proper way to make the play is for the pitcher to step off the rubber, back off it is best, as the runners start to steal. Then he has a perfect right to throw the ball to any base he thinks best in order to break up the play.

The Mother of Roger Hornsby Is Buried

Austin, Texas, Oct. 15.—In a tiny graveyard tucked away in the bend of the Colorado River tender hands laid to rest Mrs. M. O. Hornsby, mother of Rogers Hornsby, manager of the world championship St. Louis Cardinals.

She died here Sept. 29th, her last wish being that Rogers should stay with the Cardinals and lead them against New York in the World Series. He consented to this only after relatives had agreed to defer the funeral until conclusion of the diamond classic.

At the brief services at the grave Hornsby gave way to his grief. Tears streamed down his face, and the hands which for six years swung the most-feared bat in the National League trembled.

The tree-dotted cemetery, nine miles east of this Capital city, is the resting place of four generations of the family. Reuben Hornsby, great-grandfather of Rogers, who, in 1830, founded the settlement of Hornsby's Bend, and fought desperately to prevent its destruction by Indians, is among those buried there.
