Kingston Bank Clearings.

Received an Appointment.
Miss Marion Ruddick, R.R.C., has received an appointment from the Canadian Red Cross, and is now at the outpost hospital at Dryden in New Ontario. Miss Ruddick is a former Kingstonian.

Condition Is Improved.
Mr. Harry Gildersleeve has been quite ill in Toronto for some time. His many friends in Kingston will be glad to learn that a message received from Toronto on Friday morning stated that his condition showed improvement.

Jail In Good Condition.
Mr. H. M. Robins, deputy provincial secretary and inspector of prisons, has written to Sheriff Vair, to say that the inspection of the County Jail made about two weeks ago showed that everything was in first-class condition.

Meetings at Queen's.
The latter part of Thursday afternoon was given over at Queen's University to Society meetings, the Dramatic Society, Laurier Club, Levana Society and Queen's University Missionary Association all holding sessions at practically the same time.

Bid Up the Bonds.
Mr. Thomas Farmer, Perth bond dealer, was the highest tenderer for the two lots of bonds which the county of Lanark had on the market in connection with the good roads system. One lot was for \$16,000 and the other for \$60,000. Mr. Farmer outbid eight other bond dealers, his bid being 99.93.

Former Moderator Coming.
Dr. George Plégon, Toronto, former Moderator of the United

Church of Canada, will be the chief speaker at the induction of Principal Kent into his new position as head of Queen's Theological College, which is to take place on the afternoon of November 10th. Principal Kent's reply will be the other high light in a very impressive programme which has been prepared.

A Progressive Sheepman.
One of the most prominent and progressive sheepmen of the district is W. S. Keiulsky, Maynooth Station, a young man who has been farming "on his own" only since his return from overseas military service in the great war. He has a flock of fifty-three breeding ewes at present and hopes to increase the number as he becomes financially able. Mr. Keiulsky is very enthusiastic over the sheep raising possibilities of North Hastings.

Last Letter to His Mother.
An interesting letter is being shown which was written by Guard M. Earle Jenkins, killed on duty, to his mother, Mrs. B. S. Jenkins, who was recovering from a severe illness at the home of her daughter, Mrs. A. B. Brewer, Montreal. The letter was received the morning of Guard Jenkins' death. It was a letter brimming with love and regard, full of fond hopes for her recovery and urging her to visit at his home when she was able to travel. His parents prize the letter of deep affection beyond riches.

A Fish's Dinner Fatal.
On Wednesday afternoon in passing Horseblock Point Mr. Thomas Glover, keeper of Jack Straw and Gananoque Narrows Light saw lying on the shore a large fish apparently not long dead. He thought the circumstances so strange that he investigated and found the fish to be a maskinonge, weighing between fifteen and twenty pounds. Further examination revealed that the fish had been choked to death by a bull-head which it had endeavored to swallow. The "horns" of the bull-head had lodged in either side of the maskinonge's throat so that it could neither swallow nor dislodge what was intended as a satisfying meal. The bull-head was eight or ten inches long.
