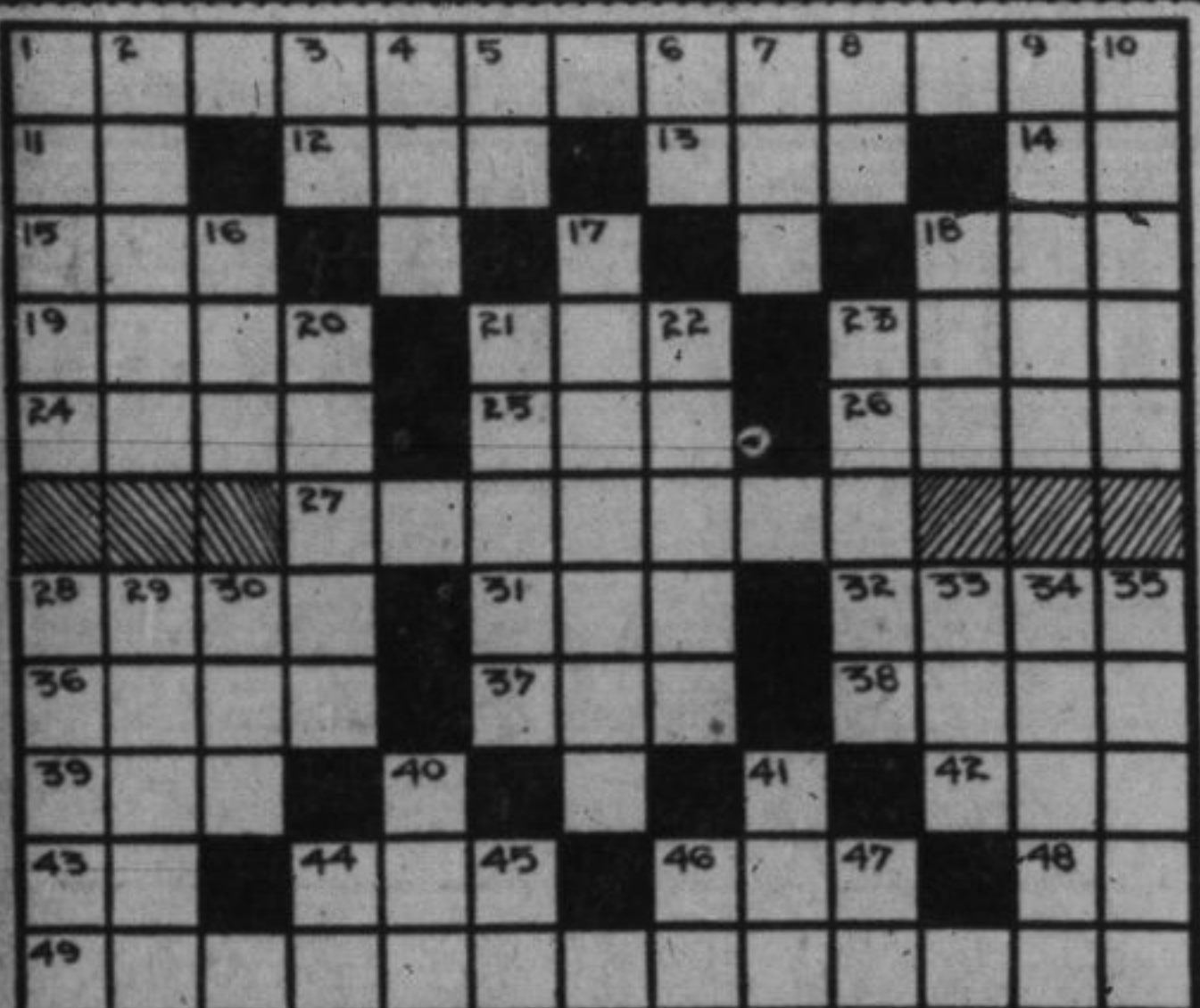


CROSS-WORD PUZZLE
