FORECASTS BROADER WATERWAYS POLICY

Mississippi System, Great Lakes and Ocean Canal Would Be Links.

St. Louis, Mo., Nov. 23.—A broader national policy toward the development of the country's inland waterways and its water resources generally is now in course of promulgation.

This was disclosed in a prepared address yesterday by Secretary Hoover, here as the principal speaker on the Mississippi Valley Association programme.

After sketching the possibilities offered by creation of a 12,000-mile water transportation system through the heart of the country, by the utilization of the Mississippi system, the Great Lakes, and the projected canal to the Atlantic, Mr. Hoover touched upon the controversies involving the latter project with a plea for expenditure of money on cement and steel rather than upon courts and political agitation.
