Resilient Engine Mountings... Rubber Buffers At Engine Supports

IN THEIR ATTEMPTS to reduce the vibration and noise made by motors, engineers realize that the car structure—composed as it is of numerous metal parts rigidly bolted or riveted together—possesses in a high degree the power of transmitting such vibrations and that those produced by any part of the mechanism are "telephoned" with more or less intensity, to all other parts of the vehicle.

All of the vessels which were anchored in the harbor during the week-end storm, cleared Monday afternoon, when the wind dropped.

The steamers McKee, Armaton, Baird, Brooklin, Gehm and Orendochart which were held over bore cleared westward.

The tug Salvage Prince and the lighter Warrenko cleared for Soda for coal Monday afternoon.

The C.S.L. carrier Glenisg unloaded a cargo of soft coal at the Canadian Locomotive Works and cleared at 9:30 o'clock this morning.

Vessels to be Laid Up. The arrangements for the steamers to be laid up in the Kingston harbor are now being finally formed and the first of next week will see several vessels in their winter berth here.

At the La Salle causeway, arrangements are being made for about twenty-five vessels to be laid up here for the winter season.

The steamer Simon Langell was in port Monday night to make arrangements for being laid up here, but cleared again on her final trip and will likely tie up here the end of this week.

The steamer Clairmont of the Coast-Mixer company, will be in at the causeway the first of next week to be laid up.

comes through the score in the cylinder wall? It seems incredible that the water comes from a leaky cylinder-head gasket and runs down the bore, collecting in noticeable amounts at the scored place? Even a little water in the oil may cause slight rusting of the bore.

However, it will collect at the bottom of the oil-pan and by drawing off a little liquid each day or two, from the oil-drain hole, you can eliminate most of it.

DOES THIS CARBURETOR FLOOD? P. J. R. writes: On long grades my engine starts sputtering at the carburetor, misses for a short time, and then, with a little coating can be made to go on.

Examination shows that the carburetor is flooded at these times. What causes this trouble?

Answer: It seems strange that when there are back explosions through the intake. These generally occur when there is insufficient gasoline in the carburetor, thus making the mixture weak.

Did you open the carburetor drain-cock to see if it was full or empty or did you conclude it was flooding from seeing gasoline drip from the air-intake? Intake drip is not a conclusive evidence of carburetor flooding, for intake explosions may blow back gasoline that has collected in the manifold, even when the level in the float chamber is very low.

It is not clear what should make your carburetor flood under the conditions you specify. We should sooner think that fuel was low in it, due to vacuum tank from a dirty screen in the carburetor fuel inlet.
