

Latest from Europe.

Petersburgh, June 20, 1812.

His Majesty the Emperor has ordered the following Proclamation to be published:

PROCLAMATION Of the Emperor of Ruffia to his Sub-

"The French Troops have pafsed the borders of our Empire; a complete treacherous attack is the reward for the observance of our alliance. For the preservation of peace I have exhausted every poffible means, confistently with the honor of my Throne and the advantage of my people. All my endeavors have been in vain. The Emperor Napoleon has been refol-Calimarcoes, Ruffel's, Ladies Leather, Kid Veffing, superfine Calicoes. Alfo, Tea; ved in his own mind to ruin Ruffia.—The most moderate proposals on our part have remained without answer. This sudden surprite has shewn, in an unequivocal manner, the groundleffnets of his pacific promifes, which he lately repeated. There remain, therefore, no further steps for me to take, but to have recourfe to arms, and to employ all the means that have been granted me by Providence to use force against force. I place full confidence in the zeal of my people and the bravery of my Troops. As they are threatened in the midst of their families, they will defend them with their national bravery and energy. Providence will crown with fuccels our just cause. The defence of our native country, the maintenance of our independence and national honor, have compelled us to have recourfe to arms. I will not sheath my fword fo long as there is a fingle enemy within my Imperial borders.

Ruffian Grand Army Bulletin.

H. Q. June 19. (July 1) 1812. The Erench army appears to have divided itself into two corps, the one following our movements, and the other endeavoring to out-flank us on the right. The first corps of our army proceeds on its march according to the plan adopted, and has already effected its junction with various divisions. The enemy in reconnoitering us, has made attacks on feveral points, but has always been repulfed with loss. In one of these skirmishes, Count Delow Denizen, General-Adjutant to his Imperial Majesty, took several prisoners, among whom is Count Octavius Segar.

On the 18th the corps of Count Wittgenstein was between Wilkomie and Holtmeny. The corps of Lieutenant-General Tutickow and Count Scherwaloff are approaching Swenzenny. General Platow has left Blalostock, and is drawing towards Wilcoka. Prince Bagration continues to approach

the first corps.

No. II. H. Q. June 21, (July 3,) 1812. During these two days no important events have taken place in the army relating to its further
