AN ACT

To repeal part of the Laws now in force for Raising and Training the Militia of this Province, and to make further Provision for the Rais fing and Training of the faid Militia .- [Paffed 5th Aug. 1812.] [Continued.]

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That from and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province from time to time, to constitute and appoint by commission under his hand and Seal a sufficient number of Officers to train, discipline and command the Militia of the Provalways, that Lieutenant-Colonels in His Majesty's Army shall command all Militia Officers whatev-

er.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That in the feveral Districts, Counties and Kidings, the Militia shall be formed into Regiments confifting of not more than ten nor less than five Companies: two of which Companies shall be stiled Flank Companies, and fhall be formed in manner hereafter menti ned; which Companies (the Flank Companies excepted) shall consist of not more than one hundred nor less than twenty private men each.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the Colonel, Lieutenant-Colonel, or Officer commanding any Regiment of Battalion, and he is hereby required to order and direct the Adjutant of such Regiment or Battalion as often as the fame may be necessary, to furnish him with complete returns of all and every person or persons within the limits of fuch Regiment or Battalion liable to Militia duty, specifying their age and place of abode, and the more easily to enable the Adjutant so to do, it shall be lawful for him to call upon any Captain or officer commanding a Company for a return of the names of the men of his Company and also of the names of fuch perfons as may have lately removed to any place within the limits of his Company; and after he shall have been furnished with such return as aforesaid, to form the Militia Men fo returned into Companies, in such manner as to him shall feem most conslusive to the interests of the Serv-

VI: And be it further enacted by the authority oforesaid, That every Male-Inhabitant from the age of fixteen to fixty, now resident, or who may hereafter become refi-46 6w dent within the limits of any Regiment or Battalion as aforefaid, shall be deemed capable of bearing Arms, and shall be considered a Militia-Man; and shall within eight days after he shall have attained the age of fixteen years, or become resident within the limits of any fuch Regiment or Battalion enrol his name with fome one Captain or other Officer commanding a Company of the faid Regiment or Battalion, who is hereby authorized and required to transmit the same with all convenient speed to the Adjutant thereof, for the information of the Colonel; Provided always that no person above the age of fifty years, shall be called upon to bear Arms except on the day of annual meeting, or in time of war or emergency.

VII. Provided also and be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the neglect of any person so to ince, and also such number of Staff present himself for enrolment, shall Officers as he shall think necessary, not be construed to prevent the & the Officers so appointed for the name of such person being enrolled; Militia, shall rank with such of the and such Colonel or Officer com-Officers of His Majesty's Forces as manding, is hereby required to enmay for the time being serve with- ter the name of every such person in this Province, as youngest of as shall come to his knowledge, uptheir respective ranks: Provided on the enrollment of the Regiment or Battalion, and when so entered, every fuch person shall be subject to perform all and every the like Militia duties & under the
