**G**EOERGE the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, defender of the Faith. To our beloved and faithful Legislative Counsellors of our Province of Upper Canada, and to our Knights, Citizens and Burgeses of our said Province, to our Provincial Parliament, at our town of York, on the eighth day of August, next, to be commenced, held, called and elected, and to every of you,

**GREETING.**

WHEREAS by our Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of June last, WE thought fit, by and with the advice of our executive council, to Prorogue our Provincial Parliament, to the EIGHTH day of August next, at which time at our town of York, you were held and constrained to appear. But WE, taking into our Royal consideration, the ease and convenience of our loving subjects, have thought fit by and with the advice of our executive council, to relieve you, and each of you, of your attendance at the time aforesaid, hereby convoking, and by these preface enjoining you and each of you, that on the Fourteenth day of September next, you meet us in our Provincial Parliament, at our town of York, there to take into consideration, the state and welfare of our Province of Upper Canada, and therein to do as may seem necessary. Herein fail not.

In testimony whereof, we have caused these our Letters to be made patent, and the great Seal of our said Province to be hereunto affixed. Witness our trusty and well beloved Sir Frederick Philippe Robinson, Knight, Commander of the most Honorable Military order of the Bath—Major General commanding our forces, within the Province of Upper Canada, and Provisional Lieutenant Governor of our said Province at Kingston, this thirtieth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and fifty fifth year of our reign.
