Herein fail not.

In testimony whereif, we have caused these our Letters to be made patent, and the great Seal of our faid Province to be hereunto affixed. Witness our trufty and well beloved Sir Frederick Philipfe Robinson, Knight, Commander of the most Honorable Military order of the Bath-Major General commanding our forces, within the Province of Upper Canada, and Provisional Lieutenant Governor of our faid Province at Kingston, this thirtyfirst day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and fifty fifth year of our reign.
