By a new arrangement entered into with the Post Master General of the U. States, Letters may be conveyed from this Office to be put on board His Majesty's packets at New York, provided the British Inland postage to Swanton, by way of Montreal, and the State's postage from thence to New York be paid at the time of putting the letters into this Office.
