GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, defender of the Faith. To our beloved and faithful Legislative Counsellors of our Province of Upper Canada, and to our Knights, Citizens and Burgessies of our said Province, to our Provincial Parliament, at our town of York, on the Thirtieth day of December, to be commenced, held, called and elected, and to every of you,

GREETING.

WHEREAS by our Proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of November last, We thought fit, by and with the advice of our Executive Council, to Prorogue our Provincial Parliament, to the Fifth day of January next, at which time at our town of York, you were held and constrained to appear. But WE, taking into our Royal consideration, the ease and convenience of our loving Subjects, have thought fit by and with the advice of our Executive council, to relieve you, and each of you, of your attendance at the time aforesaid, hereby conveking, and by these presents enjoining you and each of you, that on the Sixth day of February next ensuing, you meet us in our Provincial Parliament, in our town of York, for the actual dispatch of Public Business, there to take into consideration, the state and welfare of our said Province, and therein to do as may seem necessary. Herein fail not.

In testimony whereof, we have caused these our Letters to be made patent, and the great Seal of our said Province to be hereunto affixed. Witness our truely and well beloved Francis Gore, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of our said Province at York, this Thirtieth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and in the fifty-fifth year of our reign.
