QUEBEC, Sept. 10.

The whole number of Emigrants arrived at this Port since the opening of the Navigation, is at present 8169, and we are informed that many more were (till about to embark. But a small proportion of these Emigrants remain in this Province; having chiefly been brought up to farming, they are prevented from settling in the Lower Province, by their being unacquainted with the French Language which prevails among the Farmers here, and from a dread of the Climate, occasioned by the unfounded and silly accounts of Travellers. It is to Upper Canada and the United States, they chiefly proceed; and although they must, from their want of means and erroneous notions of the Country, undergo many hardships, those who are and continue peaceable, sober, industrious and persevering, will undoubtedly succeed in forming for themselves and families an independent and comfortable subsistence, which they could hardly ever have attained in Europe. Go where they will, their object is a virtuous one, and they ought to be cheered, and assisted by every individual who may have it in his power.

Something New.

There passed this day through this city six families, in Carts, from New Brunswick, about 70 miles above St. John, on their way by land, to the Bay of Quinte in Upper Canada, intending to settle in that Province. They brought horses with them, but bought their carts on this side the Portage, across which they dragged their baggage in sleds. They are all in good health, and we are told, are in easy circumstances, one of the name of Duncomb, rich. When they will have completed their journey, they will have travelled by land upwards of 800 miles. Their object is to obtain lands of a better quality than those which they occupied in New Brunswick.
