*From the Montreal Herald, Oct. 9.*

On Saturday last, a Dinner was given in the Mansion House Hotel, in honor of the arrival of His Grace the Duke of Richmond in this city, on his return from Upper Canada. A num- ber of the most respectable Inhabitants (notwithstanding the shortness of the notice) assembled on the occasion, sat down to an excellent dinner at half past 6 o'clock. The Hon. W. Mc Gillivray took the Chair as President, and the Hon. C. D. Lethbride as Vice. Among the company present were Col- lator and the Staff of the 37th Regt. The band of that regt. attended during the evening, and accompanied the toasts with appropriate Airs. His Grace with his usual urbanity, met the wishes of every individual who was disposed to enjoy the convivial scene. They kept it up to a late hour, when the party separated, highly satisfied with the pleasing manner; and augur- ing favourable prospects from the con- summate wisdom of their noble Guest.

The following Toasts were given on the occasion:—

1. The King.
2. His Royal Highness the Prince Regent.
3. The Duke of York and the Army.
4. The Duke of Clarence and the Navy.
5. His Grace the Duke of Rich- mond, our Illustrious Governor and Guest; may his administration of the Government of British America; ever be a source of pleasing recollection to himself.
6. The Duke of Wellington and the Allied Army in France.
7. Sir Peregrina Maitland and the Province of Upper Canada.
8. Earl Dalhousie and the Pro- vince of Nova-Scotia.

11. Success to the Commerce and Agriculture of the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada.
12. Colonel Baror and the Gas- arison of Montreal.

A London paper of the 24th July, states, that it is understood the follow- ing Circular of Instructions has been issued to the British naval command- ers:—

**June 9, 1818.**  
 "Whereas, we have received in- formation, that under color of hostil- ities subsisting between his Catholic Majesty and certain provinces, or parts of provinces in Spanish America, divers armed ships or vessels, not be- longing to, and fitted out and set forth in the dominions of his Catholic Ma- jesty, or the said provinces or parts of provinces; but having, or pretending to have, commissions of war or letters of marque from his Catholic Majesty, or persons assuming to exercise the powers of government of the said provinces or parts of provinces in Spanish America, have committed divers piratical acts and outrages against the vessels and goods of his Majesty's subjects—you are hereby authorised and required to issue in- structions to the commanders of the ships and vessels under your orders, or credible information of any piratical act or outrage committed on the high seas on any British ships or goods, by any such armed ship or vessel as afore- said, to seize and detain such armed ship or vessel, and send her, together with her master and crew, in safe custody to England, or to some port in his Majesty's Colonies, where a Court is established for the trial of offences committed on the high seas, together with such witnesses as may be neces- sary to prove the act so charged to have been committed by such ship or vessel, in order that the master and crew who may have committed any such piratical act or outrage, may be dealt with according to law."
