The proper time for thearing Jambe, is the first and second weeks in July. The wool shorn from the lambs will always meet with a ready fale, and a fair price to the hatter, who is now obliged to pay his money for fuch wool at some market town. If farmers would all shear their lambs, it would not only be a clear faving to themselves, but a great saving to FARMER. the country.

TO PRESERVE PLANTS FROM INSECTS

Translated from the French Receipt of a liquid, which has the property of destroying the infects, caternillars, grubs, bugs, ants, &c &c. &c. which attach themselves to plants, &c.
