Government Building.

A STORE HOUSE, to be built of
hewn or cut Stone, in His Majesty's
Naval Yard at Kingston, U. C. according
to plans (observing that the roof is altered
to projecting eave) which may be seen
at the office of the Commanding Engineer
at Quebec, Naval Storekeeper's Of-

fice at Montreal, and at the Commissar-
ier's Office at this place. Persons desirous
of contracting separately for the Mason's
(by the tonne) Carpenter's, or Call Iron
work, or to wholly finish the building
digging the foundation, and covering the
roof with tin—will tend to sealed tenders
to the latter Office, on the 11th of Octo-
ber next, naming two sufficient securities
for the due performance, and proper exe-
cution of the works by the 30th Septem-
ber 1820.

Other tenders will also be received for
erecting the building with wood instead of
the Cast Iron work for the inside, as described
in the drawings. Whether the build-
ing is put up with or without the Call Iron
work, the Stone will be allowed to
be quarried on the King's ground, and all
the timber materials furnished from this
yard.
