Statutes of Upper Canada.

An Act to repeal part of and to amend the Laws now in force for establishing Pub lic Schools in the several Districts of this Province, and to extend the provisions of the same.

Passed 12th July, 1819. MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

THEREAS, it bath been found expedient to repeal part of and to amend an Act paffed in the forty-leventh year of His Majesty's Reign, entirled, " An Act to establish Public Schools, in each and every Diffrict of this ! rovince." and to extend the pr visions of the fam . Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majefty, by and with the advice and cornent of the Legislative Council and Assembly fine Province of Upper Canada, conflituted & affembled by virtue of and under the au thority of an Act paffed in the Parliament of Great Britan, entituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act raffed in the fourteenth year of His Majetty's reign, entituled, " An Act for making more eftectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North Amer ica, and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province," and he the authority of the same. That provision be made by Law for the establishing a Public School in the Diffriet of Gore.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefoid. That from and out of the trates and Duties raised, levied and col lected or hereafter to be raifed, levied and collected, to and for the Public ules of this Province, and unappropriated, there be granted annually to Fie Wajeffy, Li Heirs and Succeff is, the fum of one hundred pounds, which fum of one hundred counds that be appropriated and applied and disnofed of in paying the farary of the Feacher of the faid School, which laid fum of one hun red pounds shall be paid !! by the Receiver General of this Province, in discharge of such warrant or warrants as sha'l for that purpose be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governnor or perfon administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for to His Majetty, His Lieus and Successors, through the Lords tommissioners of His Majetty's Treatury for the time being, in fuch manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successions. shall be pleased to direct.

III. And be it further enaded by the authority aforefoid, I hat it shall and may be lawful to and for the Governor, I leutenant Covernor, or person administering the Government of this Province, to appoint Truftees and a Teachet in the faid Diffriet contained in the faid of the forty-feventh year of His Majefty's Reign, entitled, " An Act 10 establish Public Schools in each and every Diffrict of this Pro-

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the Truffees of each and every Diffrict School within this Province, shall direct a public examination of their respective Schools to be held previous to the usual annual vacation, at which & they or a majority of them, tha'l affift, and it is hereby required, that fuch public ! examination shall be holden every year at the time aforefaid.

V. And be it further enaded by the authority aforesaid, That the Trultees of the respective Diffrict Schools as aforefaid, in each and every District in this Province, shall and they are hereby required once in every year after the Public examination as in the 1st concession of Richmond, from the aforesaid, to report to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, the flate of the faid Schools, the number of Scholars, the state of education, with the different branches taught in the said Schools, the number of Scholars who have completed HE Subsescribers respectfully inform | their education, together with all other matters and things, that may tend to cherish the prosperity of the said Schools, or that may in any wife benefit the fame, that the faid report may be laid before the Legislature at its first meeting for their inspection.

> V1. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That in order to extend the benefit of a liberal education to pro miling children of the poorer inhabitants, the Trustees of each and every School have the power of fending Scholars not exceed ing ten in number, to be taught gratis at the respective District Schools.

VII. Provided always, and be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the faid Scholars, fo to be taught as aforefaid, shall once in every four years, be drawn by lot, in manner following, viz: the Truftees for the common Schools now or hereafter to be established by virtue of any Act of the Parliament of this Province, shall and they are hereby authorised to return the name or names of one or more, not exceeding four from each common School of the most promising scholare as aforesaid, of their respective Schools, to the Truftees of the Diftrict School, for the District in which they shall respectively refide, which Trustees shall and they are hereby required at a special meeting to be openly held for that purpole, inscribe on a separate diffinct slip of paper, being which flip of paper shall be put into a box or glass to be provided for that purpose, and at fuch meeting as aforefaid, the same
