Statutes of Upper Canada.

An All to repeal part of and amend an all paffed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majes ty's reign, entitled " An Act to repeal an all paffed in the fifty fifth year of His Majefly's reion" entitled " An Al to Licence Praditioners in Physic and Surgery throughout this Province, and to make further provision for Licencing Juch Prac titioners."

THEREAS by the fifth clause of

an act of the Parliament of this I rovince passed in the fifty ninth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled " An Act to repeal an Act passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majefly's reign," entitled 'An 'Sto Licence Practitioners in Physic and Surgery throughout this Province, and to make further provision for licencing fuch Practitioner," the Board constituted and appointed by virtue of and under the authority thereof, is required to be held at York on the first Monday in January and July in each year, And whereas much delay and inconvenience may arise from a limitation of the fittingof the faid Board to those periods, And whereas it is expedient to make further provision for the conflitution and organi zation of the faid Board, Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the confent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Upper-Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain entitled " An Act to repeal certain parts of an act pailed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign entitled, " An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province" and by the authority of the same, that the fifth clause of the faid recited act of the fifty ninth year of His Majelty's reign, be and the fame is hereby repealed.

II. And be it further enacted by the au thority aforefaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the faid Board or the majority of the members composing the same, to appoint from time to time a fit and pro per person to be Secretary of the said Board, which Secretary shall attend the meetings of the faid Board, and keep a Record of the proceedings of the same in a book or books to be by him previded for that purpole, together with all such matters and things as to the faid Board

shall a pertain. 111. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That from and after the passing of this act the faid Board shall be kept and held in the Town of York, in the Home Diffrict, four times in each year, viz. on the first Monday in January, April, July and October respectively, and may be continued by adjournment from day to day, until the business before the Board is finished, Provided, that no one quarterly fitting shall be fo continued by adjournment, Leyond the Saturday of the

week, in which fuch fitting fall commence IV. And be it further enacted by the au thority aforefaid. That every person defirous of being examined by the faid Board, touching his qualifications for the Practice of Physic, Surgery and Midwifery or either of them, shall and he is hereby required to give due notice thereof to the Secretary aforefaid in writing, fetting forth as busines or biancies of biedical practice. that he wishes to be examined in, and shall pay to the Secretary aforefaid the fum of ten shillings, as his fee for receiving and entering the same, and a further sum of ten shillings as his fee upon his receiving the certificate of the Board.
