Statutes of Upper Canada.

An Act to repeal part of and amend an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to repeal an Act passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign," entitled "An Act to License Practitioners in Physic and Surgery throughout this Province, and to make further provision for Licensing such Practitioners."
[Passed 12th July, 1819.]

WHEREAS by the fifth clause of an Act of the Parliament of this Province passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to repeal an Act passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign," entitled "An Act to License Practitioners in Physic and Surgery throughout this Province, and to make further provision for licensing such Practitioner," the Board constituted and appointed by virtue of and under the authority thereof, is required to be held at York on the first Monday in January and July in each year, and whereas much delay and inconvenience may arise from a limitation of the sittings of the said Board to those periods, and whereas it is expedient to make further provision for the constitution and organization of the said Board, Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province" and by the authority of the same, that the fifth clause of the said recited Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty's reign, be and the same is hereby repealed.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Board or the majority of the members composing the same, to appoint from time to time a fit and proper person to be Secretary of the said Board, which Secretary shall attend the meetings of the said Board, and keep a Record of the proceedings of the same in a book or books to be by him provided for that purpose, together with all such matters and things as to the said Board shall pertain.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That from and after the passing of this Act the said Board shall be kept and held in the Town of York, in the Home District, four times in each year, viz. on the first Monday in January, April, July and October respectively, and may be continued by adjournment from day to day, until the business before the Board is finished, Provided, that no one quarterly sitting shall be so continued by adjournment, beyond the Saturday of the week, in which such sitting shall commence.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That every person desirous of being examined by the said Board, touching his qualifications for the Practice of Physic, Surgery and Midwifery or either of them, shall and he is hereby required to give due notice thereof to the Secretary aforesaid in writing, setting forth the nature of his qualifications, and shall pay to the Secretary aforesaid the sum of ten shillings, as his fee for receiving and entering the same, and a further sum of ten shillings as his fee upon his receiving the certificate of the Board.
