Statutes of Upper Canada.

An All to give effect and validity to deeds executed by Married Women in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in any of His Majefly's Colonies, and to repeal part of and amend an Ad poffed in the forty third year of His Majefly's reign entitled, " An All to enable Married Women baving real eflate to alien and convey the fame." [Passed 12th July, 1819.

HEREAS, there is by Law no Provision enabling Married Women refident abr ad, and owning real estate in this Province to all the same, Be it enacted by the King's make excellent Majesty, by and with the navice and consent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain entitled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majefly's reign, entitled, an act for making more effectual provition for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make turther provision for the Government of the faid Province," and by the authority of the fame, that from and after the paffing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful to and for any Married Women, having real estate in this Province, and being above the age of twenty one years, with the kn wledge and confent of and by any Deed or Deeds jointly with her husband, to aiien, depart with and convey any real efface, whereof the may be feized within this Province, to fuch use or uses as to her and her faid husband shall seem meet, which conveyance shall be as valid and effectual in Law to all intents and purposes, as if the were fole, any Law or ulage to the contrary netwithstanding.

Provided nevertheless, and it is hereby declared that nothing in tuch Deed contained shall have any force or effect to har fuch Married Woman, or her faid husband, or her heirs during the continuance of her coverture, or after the disfolotion thereof, or shall be held to have any force or effect whatfoever, unless such Married Women, if refident in Upper Canada, shall appear before any Judge or other person mentioned and described in a certain Act passes in the Parliament of this Province, in the forty third year of Mis Majesty's reign, entitled, " An Act to enable Married Women having real estate, more conveniently to alien and convey the same," or uniess such Married Woman being refident in Great Britain or Ireland, or any Colony belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, shall appear before the Mayor or Chief Magistrate of any City, Borough or Town corporate, in Great Britain or Ireland, or the Chief Justice, or any one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of any Colony belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, and be examined by fuch Mayor or Chief Magistrate, or Chief Justice or Judge, touching her confent to alien, and depart with fuch real effate, and shall free y and voluntarily, and without coercion, give her confent before such Mayor or Chief Magistrate, or Chief Justice, or Judge as aforefaid, to alien and depart with such real es-

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That in case it shall appear to fuch Mayor or Chief Magistrate, Chief Justice or Judge, that fuch Married Woman doth freely and voluntarily conlent to depart with, alien and convey her faid real estate without coercion on the part of her husband or any other person, it shall and may be lawful for such Mayor or Chief Magistrate, Chief Justice or Judge, to cause a certificate thereof to be endorsed on the Deed fo executed by her and her faid hufband as aforefaid, which certificate shall state the day on which such examination is taken, and shall be figned by the Mayor or Chief Magistrate, Chief Justice or Judge before whom the same shall be taken, and for as much as by the second Section of the faid recited act of the forty third year of the reign of His Majesty, the examination of any Married Woman, touching her confent to alien, depart with and convey any real estate in this Province, shall take place within fix months from the time of the execution of any Deed or conveyance, the same being found inconvenient and impracticable in many cases, it is hereby enacted, that so much of the faid fecond Section of the faid act, as enacts that fuch examination shall take place within six months from the time of the execution of any Deed or conveyance as therein stated, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That all examinations of such Married Women and certificates of fuch Deeds as before mentioned, which may be taken and made, as by the faid feveral recited acts are mentioned, shall be valid in Law. if the faid examination and certificate shall be taken and made within twelve months from the date of the execution of any such Beed or conveyance.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That no certificate to be granted as aforefaid by any fuch Wayor or Chief Magistrate of any Borough or Town corporate in Great Britain or Ireland, or of any Colony belonging to the Crown of
