## Literary.

*Ivanhoe*, by the author of *Waverley*, Rob Roy, Guy Mannering, and the antiquary.—The mighty unknown, who in his novels of *Waverley*, *Antiquary*, and *Tales of my Landlord*, has created a new era of writing, and on whose pages are stamped the spirit of genius, has presented to the world a new work, under the title of *Ivanhoe*. We have perused it with deep interest. It is indeed a Tale of other times, and carries us back to the days of the *Crusaders*; when the zeal of religious feelings was attended with all the pride and pomp of glorious chivalry, when honours and comforts at home were sacrificed for a crusade to the Holy Land. Unnoted shall she not remain  
Where meet the bright and noble train;  
Merrill shall sing and herald tell—  
Mark yonder maid of beauty well,  
'Tis she for whose bright eyes was won  
The liard field at Ascalon.

Note well her smile—it edged the blade,  
Which fifty wives to widows made,  
When, vain his strength and Mahound's spell,  
Iconium's turban'd sultan fell  
See'st thou her locks, whose sunny glow  
Half shows, half shades, her neck of snow;  
Twines not of them one golden thread,  
But for its sake a paynim bled.

Joy to the fair—my name unknown,  
Each deed, and all its praise, thine own;  
Then, oh, unbar this churlish gate—  
The night-dew falls—the hour is late.  
Insured to Syria's glowing breath,  
I feel the north breeze chill as death;  
Let grateful love quell maiden shame,  
And grant him bliss who brings thee home."

### Extracts from London papers.

#### Present from the King of Prussia to the Duke of Wellington.

The finest service of china ever imported into this kingdom, arrived from Hamburgh on the 15th, as a present from the King of Prussia to the Duke of Wellington. On Tuesday last the same was escorted to Apley House, by a party of officers belonging to the Customs, attended by three Prussian Officers. Tuesday a proportion of these glittering ornaments were set out in the great banquetting room, for the inspection of the Duke and his friends. In the centre of a most superb plateau, enriched with exquisite *or molu*, appeared a triumphal column (an obelisk) containing an inscription, giving a slight outline of the gallant achievements. Magnificent vases, pedestals, and figures; tureens, ice pails, plates, &c. all detailing the numerous exploits of British valor. One piece represents the Duke mounted on his white charger. Every article is superbly gilt with massy gold, intermixed with garter blue, white and red colors. Every plate is different, containing figures, landscapes, or public edifices in Spain, Portugal, &c. Flags and other military insignia, appear in appropriate situations. The paintings are matchless, being the combined works of the artists of almost every country.

*Court of King's Bench, Friday Dec. 10.*  
A cause was tried, in which Mr. Macaroni, an agent of the unfortunate Murat, was the plaintiff, against the publisher of the Quarterly Review, for an alleged libel in that work, imputing dishonorable conduct to that gentleman, in a transaction between Murat and the allies.—Verdict for the defendant.  
Another cause for libel was tried, in which a Mr. Wright was plaintiff, against the publisher of Cobbett's Register, for a libel imputing to the plaintiff the crime of forging, and other disgraceful acts. Verdict for the plaintiff.—Damages £500.

A Danish Translation of the New Testament, has lately been completed, and presented to the Royal Chancery. It has received the approbation of the King, who has authorized the printing of an edition of ten thousand copies. The Bible Society of Holland is now printing an edition of the Bible, on stereotype plates, presented to it by the British and Foreign Bible Society.  
A Savings Bank has been established at Botany Bay.

The Worcester Journal states that Captain Baines, the receiving officer of that district, has inspected 800 of the out-pensioners who had been ordered by the British government to appear and enroll themselves. Those unfit for duty were dismissed. The others were marched to Plymouth. Six hundred of out-pensioners who had not appeared in time to enroll themselves have been struck from the pension list.

The Radicals of Bolton, in Lancashire, have burnt Hunt in effigy, on suspicion of his being a spy.  
At a late fair in England, three watches were stolen.—All means to discover the thief were ineffectual. A few days afterwards a stranger having dropped at a

public house in the town, in a few minutes an eruption of a blood vessel caused his immediate death. On examining his person, the lost property was found.

One of the corporals in the Coldstream regiment of guards, for improper conduct in opening letters which passed through his hands belonging to his comrades was drummed out of the regiment. A rope with a noose was placed round his neck, and he was led between two drummers with the rest of the drummers beating the Rogues' March behind him. Having been dismissed, he instantly put Hunt's colors in his cap, and gave three cheers, calling out, "Hunt for ever."

There has been a very awful wreck on the Kivors. A fine West Indian, very large and valuable, named Demerara, from Demerara to Liverpool, struck on the night of the 16th, and almost immediately went to pieces. Twenty of her crew were buried in one grave on Saturday, at Collens' town, and two more on Sunday, not one saved that we know of!

The two Indianmen recently lost off the Cape of Good Hope, were insured at Lloyd's for £100,000.

### King Robert Bruce.

Dunfermline, Nov. 12.

There was found on the 10th inst. among the rubbish around the grave of King Robert Bruce, of the reinterment of whose body on the Friday preceding, an account was given in last Monday's Courant, a copper-plate, four inches wide, and five and three-eighths inches long, having inscribed on it a Crown, and the letters "Robertus Scotorum Rex," with a Cross embracing, within the angles, four raffles, each with five points. This discovery is most important, being all that was wanted to completely dissipate the doubts that still lurked in the breasts of many who were not satisfied with the existing historical accounts, that the body, about which so much has been said, was that of the Reverend Assessor of Scottish Independence.

Governor Mair, of Fort George, in Scotland, has obtained the permission of the Duke of York, to have the Prince of Saxe Cobourg inscribed upon the ravelins of Fort George, that Prince having visited said fort in the course of his tour in Scotland. Fort George is the only regular fortress in Great Britain, and its various bastions are named after the sons of his Majesty. And now the ravelins, which were the only part of the fort without a name engraved on them, have that of the Prince Leopold, and are now "His Royal Highness Prince Leopold of Saxe Cobourg's ravelins."

A jolly radical, reeling through Leeds, in a state of intoxication, attracted particular notice, from the appropriate inscription in the front of his hat:—"Reformation or Ruination!"
