To the Editors of the Kingston Chronicle. Gentlemen.

E notice in your last Paper, an advertisement figned by Samuel Aykroyd, and others, respecting the receiving and iffuing of certain descriptions of Copper Coin, wherein it is infinuated that we are the persons who had imported base Copper Coin into this Province for the purpote of speculation, and therefore, through the medium of your paper wish to inform the public that the greater part of it was actually imported and iffued by many of the fubfcribers to that very advertisement who having exhousted their stocks of the fame, and having gained their ends, have turned upon their dupes, and agreed among themselves that they would not receive them. This was done at a time when about 200 Emigrant. had just arrived, many of whom had received from the fe very subscribers the change of their last dollar in what they now choose to call bale Copper Coin.

The origin of the Copper business was improper. The trading part of the population of the town had been accustomed, since the period when the circulation of the crock Coppers was stopped, to receive ' all others.' Since that period fuch immense quantities of other description of spurious Coppers have been imported by the fame parties, that it has become absolutely necessary to put a further stop to their speculations by prohibiting the circulation of the Waterloo Harp, the Half penny Tokens, having i ritania on the one fide and a ship on the other, and Montreal thip coppers. Some of those importers. when they found that they had none but the lawful coin on hand, without public notice commenced a fubscription list for the purpose of stopping the circulation of all fuch as were not a legal tender, except Ha fpenny Tokens, of which kind they then probably had abundance, when many merchants and others with a good intention unwasily figured. In confequence of that, several other persons knowing the distrelling effect that the immediate floppage of the circulation of all coppers ex cent those mentaged in the lift, would have on the multitudes of your Emigrants and labourers then in town, agreed " to receive them in change with the exception of those above menti ned, until public notice be given in the news papers of this town." This agreement, evidently tending to benefit those persons who stood most in need of affillance, and which although so reasonable in itself, was spurned by some of those speculating importers, who in order to avoid the evils mentioned in their hand bills planned what was in fact a greater evil, namely, the iffoing of small three penny and six penny bills from the bank of U C. The confequence of which will be that all the -mail -ilver change now in circulation will be allowed to reft in the vaults of that bank, untels transferred to those of the United States, for which they will receive a premium.

We therefore request that those persons who are particularly concerned in the cir culation of the coppers will meet at Moore's Coffee Lonfe on Saturday, the 2d day of September next at the hour of 7 o'clock I M. for the purpose of making some decisive regulations concerning the fame.


