

The QUEEN'S LETTER to the MING

London, Aug. 1. The London papers of Monday contains the Queen's letter to the King. It is a very long document, far too long for our limited space. It is a retrospect of her Majesty's life fince her marriage to the present period. It concludes thus:

"On these grounds I protest against this species of trial. I demand a trial in a court where the jurors are taken impartially from amongst the people, and where the proceedings are open and fair Such a trial I court, and to no other will I willingly submit. If your Majesty persevere in the present proceeding, I shall even in the House of Parliament, face my accusers; but I shall regard any decision they may make against me as not in the fm-lieft degree reflecting on my honour ; and I will not, except compelled by actual force, submit to any sentence which shall not be pronounced by a Court of Justice. " I have now frankly laid before your

Majesty a statement of my wrongs, and a declaration of my views and intentions. You have call upon me every flur to which the female character is liable. Instead of loving, honouring and cherishing me, agreeably to your folemn vow, you have purfued me with hatred and fcorn, and with all the means of destruction. You wrested from me my child, and with her my only comfort and confolation. You fent me forrowing through the world, and even in my forrows purfued me with unrelenting perfecution. Having left me nothing but my innocence, you would now, by a mockery of justice, deprive me even of the reputation of possessing that. The poisoned bowl and the poniard are means more manly than perjured witnesses and partial tribunals; and they are less cruel, inasmuch as life is less valuable than honour. If my life would have fatisfied your Majes. ty, you should have had it on the fole condition of giving me a place in the faine tomb with my child : but fince you would fend me dishonoured to the grave, I will refift the attempt with all the means that it shall please God to give me.

" Brandenburgh House, Aug. 7, 1820." On Tuesday her Majesty under the recommendation of her advifers, wrote the above letter with her own hand to the King. It was despatched by one of her Majesty's messengers to his Majelty's cottage in Windfor Park, where his Majesty has been residing fince the late reviews. Thearrival of fuch a letter having been communicated to the King, he did not helitate to decline receiving it through any other fource than that by which communications are usually made to him, namely, through Lord Liverpool, as his Prime Minister. With this answer the messenger returned to Brandenburgh Hounse the same night. The enfuing morning the letter was forwarded to the Earl of Liverpool, with a command from the Queen, that he should lay it before his Majetty at his eartiest convenience. The Earl of Liverpool acknowledged the receipt of the letter, and intimated his inwith her Majelty's direction. Thus matters remained till Friday, when, no answer having been received, another letter was fent from her Maje fty to Lord Liverpool, referring to that which she had directed to the King, and expressing furprife that she had received no official acknowledgement of its having been conveyed to the quarter for which it was intended. This letter was forwarded to Lord Liverpool, who wrote the same day, from Coombe Wood, that he had not received the King's commands to make any communication to her Majesty in consequence of her letter.

After our form was made up we received by the ship Magnet, in 34 days from Liverpool, London papers to the 22d, and Liverpool to the 24th of August, inclusive.

The trial of the Queen proceeded without any extraordinary occurrence until Monday the 21st, when after finishing his opening speech, the Attorney General introduced his fir t witness by the name of Theodore Majocci. "On hearing his name called (says the Courier,) she turned round and screamed aloud, "What!!-Theodore!!" and hasnly darted from her seat, through the door of her apartment, followed after a short interval by Lady Ann Hamilton. This was about half past tweive o'clock. Her Majesty had not been seated above three minutes. The scream and exclamation of the Queen operated upon the feelings of the house with electric effect. Along pause ensued. Peers, Counsel and evidence of their eyes and ears, not a
