IN COUNCIL, 21ST NOVEMBER, 1825. For the information of persons arriving in Upper Canada, as settlers, the following summary of the rules which His Majesty's Government has thought fit to lay down for the future regulation of grants of land in the Province, in conformity to the system which has been recently adopted with respect to other Colonies of His Majesty, has been prepared in conformity to instructions from Earl Bathurst.

- 1. A valuation will be forthwith made of the lands throughout the Colony, and average prices will be struck for each District. 2. All the lands in the Colony not hitherto granted, and appropriated for public purposes, will be offered for sale at the average prices thus fixed. 3. All persons proposing to purchase lands must transmit a written application to the Government through the office of the Surveyor General, in a certain prescribed form, which will be delivered to the party applying, by the Surveyor General, or by an officer to be appointed by him for that purpose, in the several Districts, on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d.

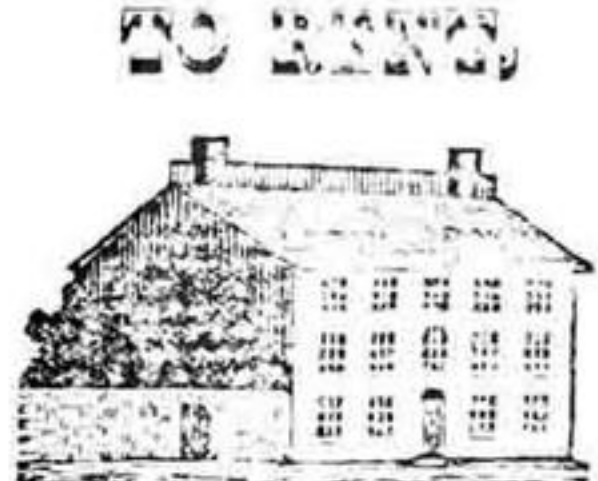
