I was often warned of my danger, and dvised to avoid those destructive ways I would not listen to the friendly counand consequently have involved myin shame and ruin. It was liquor that led me to perform the fatal deed, that brings me to this untimely and shameful death. consequently incapable of taking care of myself. Ardent spirits always excited in under its influence I met the unfortunate notwithstanding I have been guilty of these and many other crimes, I trust God hath mercifully forgiven me; and I now feel that am at peace with God and all mankind: feel that I have experienced pardon through the atoning blood of the Saviour, and am now fully prepared to meet death. I most sincerely and heartily forgive every one who has ever injured me, and humbly beg the forgiveness of any one whom I may have injured.
