

To the Editor of the U. C. Herald.

In looking over your paper of last Wednesday, I observed that you had taken some pains to sum up the numbers of those persons who had signed valedictory addresses to our late Lieutenant Governor...

It appears by the foregoing statement, that about 3,000 persons (one third of whom are probably not freeholders) have signed the addresses to Sir Peregrine Maitland. The population of Upper Canada is estimated at 200,000, so that His Excellency bore with him the signatures of almost one-sixtieth part of the inhabitants over whom he governed for the last ten years.

Now, Sir, give me leave to say that in these remarks you have strangely forgotten that candour and fairness which ought to distinguish an Editor of a paper which professes to be the most temperate in the Province...

My only object is to expose the effects of your remarks—for they really are not to be admired, either as regards their temper or their drift. A valedictory address is a mark of respect which is due to a Governor who has conscientiously discharged his high functions for the long space of ten years...

The number of signatures to the addresses, Sir, is to be sure, not very great. They do not constitute a majority of the inhabitants—but I may ask, on what similar occasion that has been the case. At all events, Sir, you cannot question the sincerity of the testimonials of respect and esteem presented to His Excellency.
