Again, when he contemplates still more attentively the thoughts, acts and passions of this his sentient, intelligent self, he finds indeed, that he can remember, and, by the aid of memory, can compare and discriminate, can judge and resolve; and, above all, that he is irresistibly compelled, from the preception of any phenomenon without or within him, to infer the existence of something prior, which stands to it in the relation of a cause, without which it would not be.
