Going Up. Leaves Ogdensburgh, Thursday evening, Kingston, Friday morning, Sacket's Harbor, Friday noon, and arrives at Oswego same afternoon. Coming Down. Leaves Oswego, Friday, at 6 P. M., Sacket's Harbor, Friday, 11 P. M., Kingston, Saturday, 7 A. M., and arrives at Ogdensburgh, Saturday afternoon.

And after the first of September, the respective Boats will resume their trips as first above stated.
