Flour.—As we have already stated, a parcel of 200 bbls. U. C. Fine was disposed at 25s. per bbl. 90 days, deliverable at the opening of the navigation. A lot of 260 bbls. met with a buyer at 29s. per bbl., 90 days. We quote Fine now at 30s. a 31s 6d. The Middlings is all in one hand; 27s 6d has been obtained through the week for small parcels, but 29s 9d is now demanded.

Grain.—A larger supply has been brought in during the last seven days, than for some previous. We quote the same prices. W. L. Produce.—Sugar has been disposed of for consumption at our quotations. 18 puns. Jamaica changed hands at 4s. 2d. per gal. Several parcels of liquors were put up at auction, but there was no inclination to bid. One lot, consisting of 10 puns of Demerara Rum, 1 to 5, went off at 2s 5d a 2s 6d.

Provisions.—Business is still brisk. We have been informed of the following sales:—60 brls. Irish Prime Mess at D15; 200 brls. Mess at D21; 110 brls. Prime (new) at D14, deliverable in May; 60 brls. Prime Mess D17; and fifty brls. Prime do. were bought at D17 to sell again. Holders of Beef wish to obtain an advance upon the prices of last week. A reduction has taken place in the price of butter. Fresh Pork has been brought more plentifully to market.
