Fortunes have already been made by persons engaged in the mining business; -- fortunes are yet in embryo, which will open and expand as industry, guided by scientific principles, shall be encouraged and protected.

Mining has been prosecuted with various success from time immemorial. and is now reduced to a system, based upon scientific principles; be guided by such lights, and you will not wander in the dark, but advance with full confidence to certain results. You will then avoid unnecessary expense, and serve yourselves and posterity .- [Watertown Engle.

Watertown and Cape Vincent Rail Road .-The survey and estimates for this road are completed, and the result submitted to the publie in the report of the engineer Mr. Dewey. The report estimates the cost of constructing the road, at \$145,965 88 or \$55,781 96 per mile. The distance is about 25 miles.
