tent of one half the amount of such propertyand if proper means are taken to ascertain the value of the security, we should suppose the public to be well protected. But how an institution, professing to issue a circulating medium, with the proposed protracted term of payment, can provide for that issue, without the aid of a subscribed Capital, is to us a problem somewhat difficult of solution.

We believe the system under discussion, originated from Mr. Banks, of the Newcastle District, a gentleman of good abilities, who has evidently paid much attention to the subject of Banking.

He proposes, as he terms it, to substitute a currency drawn upon time, instead of treasure, thereby offering financial facilities, hitherto unknown!' We have not the advantage of having one of Mr. B's. explanatory letters by us, but if we had the voluminous exposé necessary for the perfect elucidation of this topic, would preclude the possibility of its being inserted in a passing editorial remark. We are aware obligations issued on undeniable security to double their value, ought to be valid; this appears to be a fundamental principle of the Institution, and the obligations given for this security, are not obligatory on the Bank, till three months after their debit transactions become due, or in plain terms they issue notes, payable 12 months after date, and receive obligations with twice the security attached to them, payable 9 months after date, thus to use a phrase of the Projector, they " make their credit obligations become due three months prior to their debit obligations becoming due." This institution, according to its Constitution, professes to receive from all persons as liquidation of their obligation, their own notes, dated 6 months prior to the bill the discounter gave becoming due, or if we comprehend the system, a bill discounted in January, at 9 months, would, of course, be due in October, and the Bank would take notes dated in January, February, or March, in liquidation for bills discounted, and to facilitate this plan, the Institution proposes to have an Exchange Office, where it would receive its own notes that had been dated 6 months more, for which it would give a premium of twenty shillings for every hundred pounds, payable in its own notes, dated at time of exchange, which notes purchased to our supposition, would enable those who wanted to renew, to do so, upon paying 30s. in the Hundred Pounds, for the accommodation, and as the originator of this system, in one of his letters, if we recollect right, says if "I buy at one time, and pay 80s. at another, I will receive 20s., consequently there can be only half per cent. to pay for renewals, upon the verage."

We do not profess to be well acquainted with the system in all its details, but it certainly appears to us that the plan is an ingenious one. We shall again revert to the subject.

The Voluntary System .- The following extract, on the subject of the Voluntary Church System, is from Blunt's sketch of the Reformation. The reasoning is clear and forcible, and the extract altogether is worthy of some attention, in the present circumstances of the different Churches in this Province.
