The Rideau Company will have a steamer arrive and depart at and from this port every day during the season, performing the distance from Montreal to Kingston in 5 days.

Messrs Hooker & Henderson, and H. & S. Jones will also have a daily line on the same route—as well as Messrs. Sanderson & Murray—some of whose boats will be propelled on the Ericson principle.

The "Cobourg" will ply during the season between Prescott and Queenston, touching at the various ports, performing the trip in a week, and affording a pleasant mode of travelling to persons not in a hurry.

The Hon. John Hamilton, is about placing a daily boat between Kingston and Oswego, by which route the traveller will be enabled to reach N. York from this place in 41 hours at an expense of \$40.

We understand that His Excellency Lord Sydenham will leave Montreal for Kingston about the first of May.

Some of the Lower Canada papers recently mentioned that His Excellency did not intend to make Kingston his permanent residence—that on the contrary His Lordship would return to Montreal immediately on the breaking up of the Session of Parliament. We are happy to have it in our power to state that there is no truth whatever in this rumor.

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The Rideau Canal will not be open for the purposes of navigation until about the end of the first week in May.

More burning on the Frontier.—On Saturday night last, the 10th inst., "The Gothic Cottage Inn," opposite Clifton House Hotel at the Falls of Niagara, was burned by an incendiary. The house had been leased the day previous for a term of five years. The tenant had not yet removed his furniture, but it had been occupied for a month previously. The whole was the property of Captain Creighton, now a resident in Toronto, who having been unable to effect any insurance thereon thus suffers a loss of between 6 and £700. This gentleman's Barns, Stables, and outhouses, on the same property were also burned by an incendiary in September, 1839.—[Patriot.]

We are glad to be able to announce that efficient preparations have been made for completing the Erie and Ontario Railroad from Chippawa to Queenston, and that the work will be immediately commenced and vigorously prosecuted. The Lumber required has been contracted for, and the greater portion of it delivered; and intelligence has been received from England of the shipment of the iron, which is by this time half way across the Atlantic.—[Niagara Chronicle.]

We regret to announce the death, at Calcutta, of Col. Hillier, so well known and universally respected in this province while Civil Secretary and Aid-de-Camp to Lieut.
