MELANCHOLA ACCIDENT AND LOSS OF LIFE. It is over painful tash to report a most au ful disaster which took place pretentay, between eleven Jan. 29. p'elock and own, and occurioned the destruction of to less than eight houses in Champlain street, opposite to the Custom House, with a frightful loss f names life, the extent of which has not yet been fully ascertained. A large persion of the cliff, from near the fact of the Citadel at Cope Diamond, to an extent of about 200 feet, gave way, and falling into Champlain street, entirely everyhelmed the houses beneath and their numerous immates, under the ponderous masses of rock and rubbish, that suddeny fell, so silently and without previous indication of danger, that none of the unfortunate sufferers had time to creape. The sentry on duty at the ate of the Queen's store, perceived the side of the precipies in motion, and eve he could atter a cry of Liem, which would indeed have been unavailing, the while had descended into the street, prestrating the buildings beneath, carrying with it their fragments, and covering the road completely to the wall of the Coston House. So great is the quantity of rock, and so large the masses which have thus been displaced, that the progress of clearing them away can be but slowly effected. The stones composing the wall of the fortification, on the creek of the rock, to the extent we have above stated, appeared thinly scattered on the surface of the debrire in comparatively small fragments, and in one direction only, did they reach the base of the rock.
