

BILL.

An Act to provide for the better internal Government of that part of this Province which formerly constituted the Province of Upper Canada, by the establishment of Local or Municipal authorities

HEREAS, for the better protection and management of the Local interests of Her Majesty's Her Majesty's Service, on full pay, nor any Mem-subjects, in that part of this Province which former-ber or Officer of the Legislative or Executive Counsubjects, in that part of this Province which formerly constituted the Province of Upper Canada, it is expedient that Municipal authorities be established in the several Districts of that portion of the Province :- Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, intituled, "An Act to Re-unite the Prorefaces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the District Council, who shall have been attainted for year, shall be those whose names shall be meat "Government of Canada;" and it is hereby enact- treason or felony, in any court of law in any of Her drawn. ed by the authority of the same, that the inhabitants of each of the Districts in that part of this Province which formerly constituted the Province of Upper Canada, and of each and every District which may be hereafter established in that portion of this Province, in the manner by law provided, shall upon, from and after the first Monday in January, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, Be a Body Corporate, and as such, shall have perpetual succession and a common scal, with power to break, renew, and alter the same at plea-
