An Act to repeal a certain Act therein mentioned and to exempt the Members of Companies of Firemen, lawfully established from serving as Jurors, and in the militia, except in certain ea-

[18th September, 1841.] WHEREAS it is expedient to regent an Act pos-sed by the Parliament of the late Province of Upper Ganada, in the seventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth and intituled "An Act to make further and more effectual provision for the prevention of accidents by fire in the several Police Towns in this Province," in order to extend the provisions of the same to the whole Province of Most Excellent Majesty, by and and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, consituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled "An Act to Re-unite the Provinces." ince of Upper and Lower Canads, and for the Torernment of Canada," and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the aforesaid Act shall be, and is hereby repealed.
