Among the many promotions and appointments that have taken place in consequence of the birth of the young Prince, there is none that affords the Kingstonians greater gratification than that of Col. the Hon. Henry Dundas, C. B., to be one of Her Majesty's Adjutants-General. Col. Dundas commanded this Garrison and District (which they extended from Cateau du Lac to Penqu' Isle), and was occupied by between 5 and 6,000 Troops, Regulars and Militia during the troubles, and no Officer could have given more universal satisfaction than the gallant Colons, who are thorough soldiers, and possessed the peculiar art of making all with whom he had occasion to act, happy and contented.

That gallant son of Scotia Sir James McDonald, has been made a Lieutenant-General, and will return from the command of the Brigade of Guards.

We unhesitatingly repeat that the spirit of envy which actuates the several advanced elements of our interests, take rise in the deep mortification they feel at Kingston's having been selected as the most central, the most convenient, the most populous, and consequently the most eligible place for the Seat of Government. And so soon, because our gracious Queen, in the exercise of her Royal Privileges, has deemed it advisable to avail herself of these advantages, Kingston and its surrounding inhabitants must be assailed far and near with the most malignant calumnies.

It is, we repeat, plainly perceptible, that self-interest is at the bottom of all this; and self-interest it is that constrains the calumniators to remain unwilling residents here. But again we say, let the discontented with Kingston and its unceasing importunity, remove to their favorite positions at Toronto, Quebec or elsewhere, and numerous will be the volunteers who will gladly offer to supply their needs to have been exercised in some parts of the District, FRONTENAC.
