PROCEEDINGS OF THE MIDLAND DISTRICT COUNCIL.

SECOND DAY, WEDNESDAY, MAY 11.

The minutes of the preceding day having been read, the Warden acquainted the Council that the Corporation of Kingston had appointed a committee, with a request that they might confer with a committee of the District Council on several matters relating to the interests of the Town and District.

The said committee were then brought up. By Mr. Wheeler, it is the petition of John Counter and others, praying that Union Street, in the Township of Kingston, may be drained; and by the same, the petition of Joseph Russell and 29 others, against a road in the centre of lot No. 8, 5th concession of Richmond; by Mr. Cameron, the petition of John Bush and 11 others, praying for a road across Wall's Island, from the present turnpike road along the south shore; by Mr. Denike, the petition of George Seeger and 23 others, relating to School District No. 13, in Frobervilleburgh by Mr. Ashby, the petition of McLeod & Logan and 37 others, praying that the concession road from Kingston may be carried across Upper Bay; by Mr. Denike, the petition of Jonathan Jackson and 23 others, praying for a road across the south shore of the Lake of Two Rivers; by Mr. Seeger, the petition of John Shepherd and 2 others, relating to roads and paths No. 19, in the 1st and 21st concessions of Loughborough; by Mr. Denike, the petition of John Bush and 18 others, relating to a road between lots 8 and 9 in 2d concession of Frobervilleburgh; by Mr. Kirkpatrick, the petition of John Bush and 2 others, relating to roads and paths No. 19, in the 1st and 21st concessions of Loughborough; by Mr. Denike, the petition of John Bush and 18 others, relating to a road between lots 8 and 9 in 2d concession of Frobervilleburgh; by Mr. Kirkpatrick, the petition of Robert Shannon and 9 others, praying that the school house in school district No. 12, in the township of Kingston, may be allowed to remain on the foot of its road.

Mr. Kirkpatrick brought up the report of the School Committee for the township of Kingston. The action of the court will read the report of George Chapman, Esq., on a bill of lading, dated April 12, 1811, addressed to a house in Redwood, referring to the petition of Alex. Campbell and others; and also by the same, a report on the application of Alex. Boyd and 15 others, freeholders of Richmond, for a road in the 5th and 14th concessions of said township.

Mr. Ashby brought up a statement from the Clerk of the Peace on the subject of the humours and orgies now maintained at the expense of the District.

Mr. Ashby, from the managing committee appointed at the last session to have charge of the Court House, read a bill of lading, dated April 12, 1811.

Mr. Kingston brought up the report of George Bruce, D. D. S. of the exploring party appointed to mark out roads and examine lands, &c. in several of the rear townships, accompanied by a map.

On motion of Mr. Kirkpatrick, seconded by Mr. Ashby, ordered that the petition of Wm. Lennox, and others, and of John Counter and others, praying for a grant of money to be expended on the Little Ca-tarqu Bridge, and on Union Street, be referred to the committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Kirkpatrick, seconded by Mr. Ashby, ordered that the petition of Robert Shannon and others be referred to a special committee of the townships of the township of Kingston, be referred to the committee on schools.

On motion of Mr. Kirkpatrick, seconded by Mr. Ashby, ordered that the report of George Chamberlain on the petition of A. Campbell and others, be referred to the committee on roads and bridges.
