Cartwright and Archeste, which we will also write part of the inhabitants of King-ton, to remonstrate with Lord Stanley, upon the removal of the Seat of Government to Montreal have been treated by his Lordship in the most haughly and contemptuous way, and received from his Lordship a most decided and positive answer that he had made up his mind that Montreal is the fit and proper place for the Scat of Government.-This question may now be considered as settled. Sir Ro-bert Peel is in favour of Kingston, but he does not like to interfere with Lord Stanley's decision.

No time could be more favourable than the prosent for the organization of the Upper Canada Trust and Lean Company, and the project is very favorably regarded in the city, but oning to the slowness with which Colonial affairs pass through Downing Street, it seems that Mr. Atcheson, the Agent for Uppe Canada for carrying out in this country the objects of the Provincial Act, has not yet found himself in a condition to introduce the marter formally to the British public.
