TO THE FREE AND INDEPENDENT ELECTORS OF THE COUNTY OF FRONTENAC. GENTLEMEN:—I have been requested by several respectable freeholders to come forward as a candidate for your suffrages, at the next general election. I have now the honor to inform you, that should I be spared in health until that period, that I shall present myself at the poll. I am not a party man; I deprecate party spirit; and should you do me the favor to elect me, I shall regard your interests and the interests of the Province, as the sole end and aim of my political career.
