WELLAND CANAL. At a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Welland Canal company, held at the Welland Canal Office, St. Catharines, on Thursday the 4th of September, the President submitted the following correspondence, which took place in consequence of a notice appearing in the Upper Canada Gazette, under date of July 19th, of which the following is a copy:—

Take notice, that an application will be made at the next session of the provincial Parliament, for an act to impose a tax of two pence an acre upon all uncultivated lands, in the Niagara, Western, and London districts, and one penny an acre upon all uncultivated lands in this province.
