TREMENDOUS CONFLAGRATION.

The night or Wednesday, Dec. 16.h, will long be remembered as the date of the most destructive conflagration which ever took place in this city, or on the American Continent, "The great fire" of 21st September 1776 prostrated nearly as many buildings (492) but they, and especially their contents, were of far less value than the 500 or 600 buildings and their contents destroyed by the conflagration of Wednesday night.
