SPAIN.

The two Chambers were constituted on the 17th, when S. Castroey Orongco was the Finance Minister, and his section of the Cabinet. The bill relative to the contitution was presented to the Congress on the 18th. The following is an outline of the new "Constitution:"-The preamble of the present Constitution is to be suppresed, because it asserts the national supremacy. The members of the Senate are not to be elected, but to be appointed by the Crown for life. Political offences, includng those of the press, are not to be submitted to trial by jury. The National Guard is to be suppressed; and instead a similar force is to be organized in districts which the Government may think to need it. The article requiring the Courts to assemble every where is suppressed; leaving the Crown to convoke them only when it thinks fit. The Queen is to be allowed to contract a marriage without the consent of the Cortes. (This is supposed to point at a marriage with the Prince of the Asturias, son of Don Carlos.) The clause, forbidding the Queen to leave the kingdom ex-

cept by leave of the Cortes, is suppressed. The Queen downger, Queen Christina, was married to S. Munoz, at the Palace at Madrid, on the 13th ult. The Ministers were present, and the reremony was per-
