I have a large farm lying eight miles from the ship navigation, worth as much as half the county you live in. I have a large building in Oregon city that cost me about \$7,000. I have also property in the city of Multnomah on the west side, and Linton 20 miles below, at the head of the ship navigation. I have 100 hogs, 2 dogs, 1 cat, 3 children, and the old woman, with all the conveniences. I think it a fine country—good food, timber tall, and climate fine; no snow in winter, but they have five months continual rain; still the crops are fair, and the cattle good."

We find in them some commercial regulations recently passed by the Departmental Assembly of Yucatan, for the ports of Bacalar, Campeche, Laguna, San Isidro (Carmen) and Sisal.
