LATER FROM THE ARMY.

Military Movements.-Col. May's Dragoons attucked by a body of Mexicans!!-Part of his Command taken Prisoners.

The brig Georgiana, from Tampico, on the 14th ultimo, arrived at New Orleans on the 22nd -General Shields entered Victoria, with General Quitman, on the 19th General Quitman drove the Mexicans before him for thirty miles before entering Victoria. The Mexicans were very reluctant to give up the place, but went out on one side as General Quitman entered on the other .--Quitman having no cavalry could not pursue them. Col. Kearney parted with General Taylor at Montemorelis, and pushed on with General Quitman to Victoria, and thence alone to Tumpico. There were reasons to suspect that General Butler and party had been murdered.

FROM SATILLO .- The Mexican army, it was believed, were not far off. The Mexican soldiers seen in the neighborhood of Saltillo, are supposed to have been advanced parties of some 1500 or 2000 men in possession on this side of the Desert between Saltillo and San Luis, to destroy the water works, in case the American army should move on farther in the direction of San Luis, I which precludes the idea of any rerious attack being contemplated on General Worth or General Wool.
