It is enabled to do this, because the borrower is also a stockholder, and consequently a participator in the profits of the Society-because his stock, proportionately with that of others, benefits

by his own and others borrowing.

The Shares are fixed by the By-Laws at £100 each, and are paid up by monthly subscriptions of 10s .- When a sufficient sum is received from these subscriptions, it is put up at Public Sale among the Stockholders, in lots of £100 each, and knocked down to him who gives the highest bonus.
