The Society increases in prosperity. At the beginning of February, the number of shares taken up (before the premium of £1 10s. per share was exacted) was 1080. FOLICE COURT AT TORONTO.

On Monday and Tuesday last, our City Police was occupied with the investigation of a most extraordinary case of moral depracity and lightlious disregard of civil law.

A colored man man, of Bioxedon, who has to some time resided in King Street, near Frederick Street, was complained of last Saturday to His Worship the Mayor and Alderman Workman, by Col. O'Brien and James Beatty. Eq., as being the keeper of a house frequented by women of intemple character. A wasrant of arrest was accordingly issued against Bloxsom, and a large number of witnesses were summoned. The case came on for examiniation before Alderman Gurnett, Dennison, and Workman, on Monday, and after a long sitting, was adjourned until next day. On Tuesday evening the Magistrates closed the case by committing Bloxsom to jail, to take his trial at the approaching assizes, in default of proper surcties.

.This case is one of very deep intofest to the community; and the Magistrates who condected the investigation with so much patience and propriety, are justly estitled to the best thanks of the citizens. . The facts elicited from the witnesses were of the most appalling character. Bloxsom had, for more than two years, in the very centre of a respectable and peaceable vicinity, carried on the nefations afocation of harboring profligate women; and his house had been the rendezvous of gangs of disorderly and immeral men. To such a height had this unchecked nuisance at length arisen, that the neighbors could no longer rest in their beds: and the entire population seem to have risen to denounce the outrage upon common decency.

O'Brien, Mr. Fenwick, Mr. Heighton, Mr. Cawthra, and one of the cabmen, who have been in the habit of driving abandoned women to Bloxsom's house, was of the most decisive character; and Alderman Gurnett, in pronouncing the decision of the Bench, expressed himself in very strong terms on the heigous nature of the
